There is a lesson plan outline in this unit. There are five steps within this unit, which may take about a week to complete, depending on how long your ELA block is. Activities range from group work, partner activities, whole group lessons, and independent activities.

Use singular and plural nouns with matching verbs in basic sentences (e.g., He hops, We hop).	
Vocabulary: singular noun plural noun verb	Fluency: Anchor charts Picture, Noun, & Verb Cards Interactive Flipbook
<p>Activities To Do:</p> <p>Day 1: Create anchor chart with definitions of singular nouns or plural nouns with examples, or display mini posters. Ask students to write one example of each on white boards.</p> <p>Day 2: Students will match the picture of singular and plural nouns to the word cards to describe them.</p> <p>Day 3: Create anchor chart that describes nouns and verbs in a sentence, or display mini posters. Ask students to write one example of each on white boards.</p> <p>Day 4: Students draw a picture card. Then they find the noun card and match it to a correct verb tense to create a sentence.</p> <p>Day 5: Students fold the book in half, cut the bottom line. Then they will act out the sentences.</p>
