




Lesson Plan Activities

There is a lesson plan outline in this unit. There are 5 steps within this unit, which may take about a week to complete, depending on how long your ELA block is.




Graphic Organizers

You're also provided with graphic organizers to use during your unit, as assessments, as morning work, or throughout the year as review.




Centers
