

#### Lesson Plans

 There are 5 steps in the lesson plan of this unit. Depending on how long you have for mini lessons for Foundational Skills, you can choose to do all 5 steps in one day or break it up over 2-4 days. I suggest at least 10 minutes for your daily lesson, then 15-20 minutes+ for practice time. Putting your activities together may take a week to complete.

There is one informal assessment activity at the end of the lesson plan. When you're finished teaching your unit, use this assessment with your students.



You're also provided with graphic organizers to use during your unit, as assessments, as morning work, or throughout the year as review.




## Centers
