

essons

There are 3 mini lessons in this unit. Each mini lessons will likely take
more than one day to complete, so you can break them up over the
course of one to three days. It all depends on how much time you
have for your reading block. I suggest at least 10-15 minutes for your
daily lesson, then 15-20 minutes+ for practice time. Putting your mini
lessons together may take between one to two weeks.

 These can be used throughout the unit as you see fit. You can use them with your lessons if you need more or use them within your independent reading time.

Reading Passages

These can be use throughout the unit as you see fit, too. They can
be used during partner reading time, independent reading time, or a

 Use each of these resources as you see fit. If you do centers or hands-on learning time, include these pieces within the centers for extended practice.


Assessment


Mini Lessons






What to do:

Assessment

The unit is wrapped up with a summative assessment. Within this assessment, the students are asked a few questions about the standard itself. Then, they are asked to perform tasks aligned with that standard. There are two short texts, one with multiple choice texts and one with short answer. In the beginning and middle of the year, I suggest reading the assessment aloud to the class as they take the test. That way, they are tested on the actual skill, not their reading
