

# Spring Reader's Theater

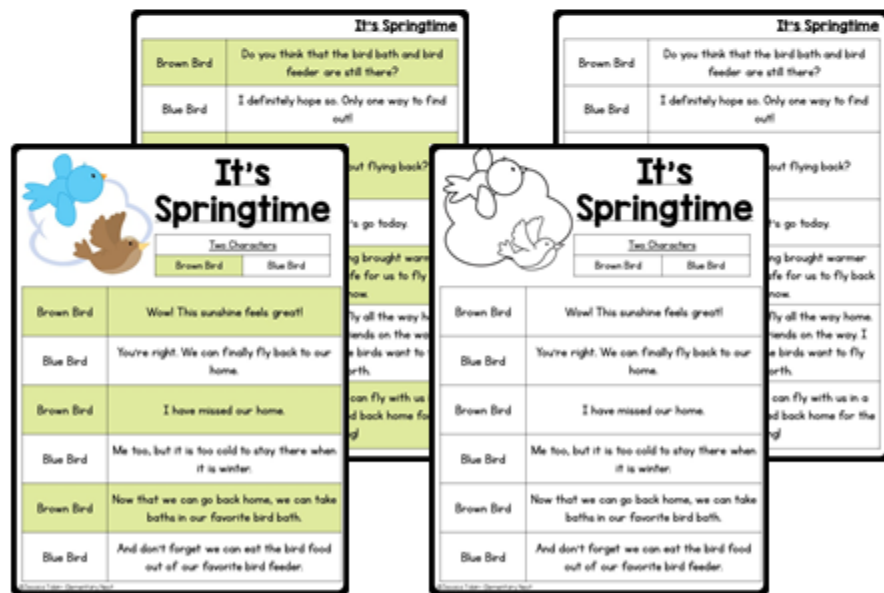

- has black & white copy

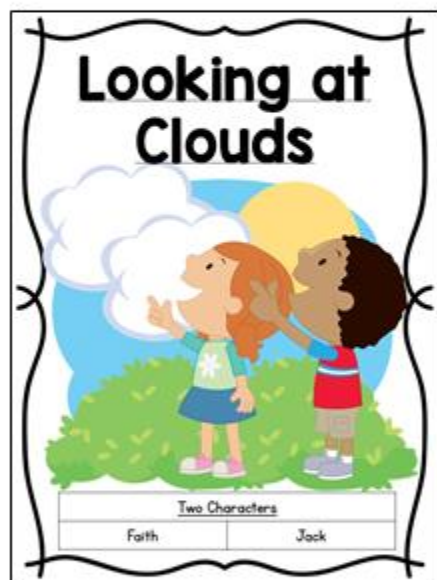

13. Backyard Battle (4 characters)

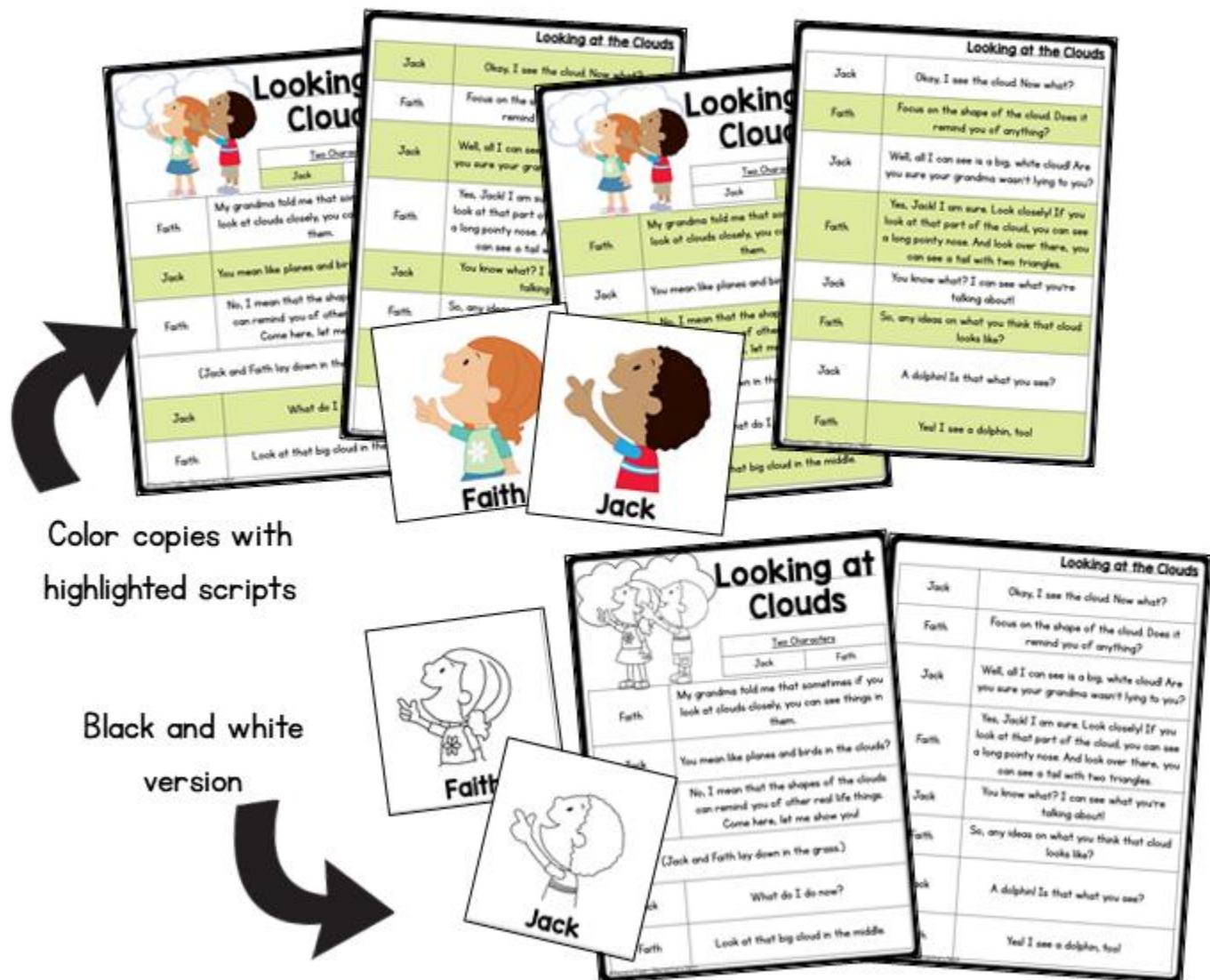
