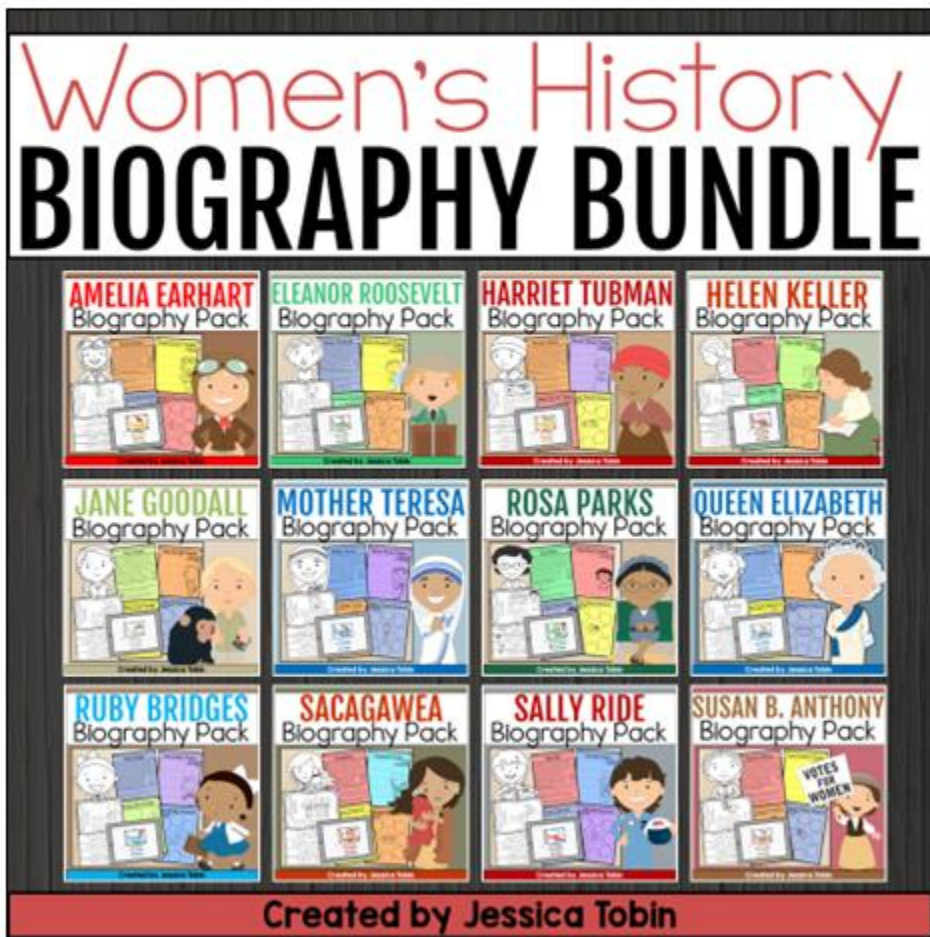


Influential Women Bundle

What you need:

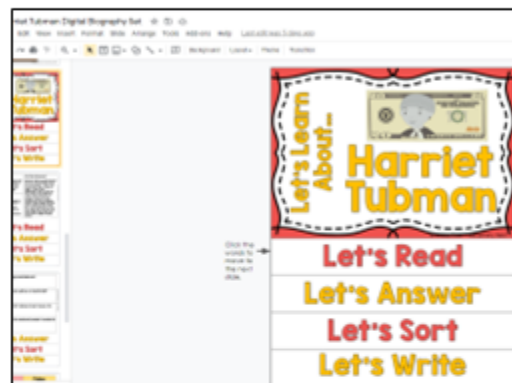
- A Google Classroom account

What to do:

- Open document using links on this page.

- Make another copy to share with your students. Get the shareable link using the "Share" button in the top right corner.

Options for sharing:

Name: Rosa Parks

Rosa Parks is very influential woman in American history. She was born in Alabama in 1913 and attended an all-girls school for African Americans. At that time in Alabama, it was common for people to be separated because of their race. Rosa Parks was a member of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, an organization that fought for equality and believed in civil rights. Parks was a member of the Montgomery Bus Boycott. In 1955, Parks was arrested because she wouldn't move on the bus.

Name: Let's Learn About...

Rosa Parks was born on February 4th, 1913. She lived in Alabama. When she started going to school, she went to an all-girls school for African Americans. Back then, segregation kept African Americans and white people apart simply based on their skin color. Different races were treated very unfairly. They were segregated in schools, stores, and more.

Rosa Parks graduated high school at age 20. She was a member of the NAACP, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. This group fought for the rights of African Americans. She was a civil rights leader who peacefully worked towards equal rights for all.

Rosa Parks will always be remembered for her role in the Montgomery Bus Boycott. One day on a bus, she sat in a spot on a bus that was reserved for white people. When she tried to move, the bus driver told her to move. When she refused to move, she was arrested and put in jail. Her arrest helped to organize a boycott of the Montgomery bus system. A year-long boycott, it was finally decided that the bus system was allowed to be segregated.

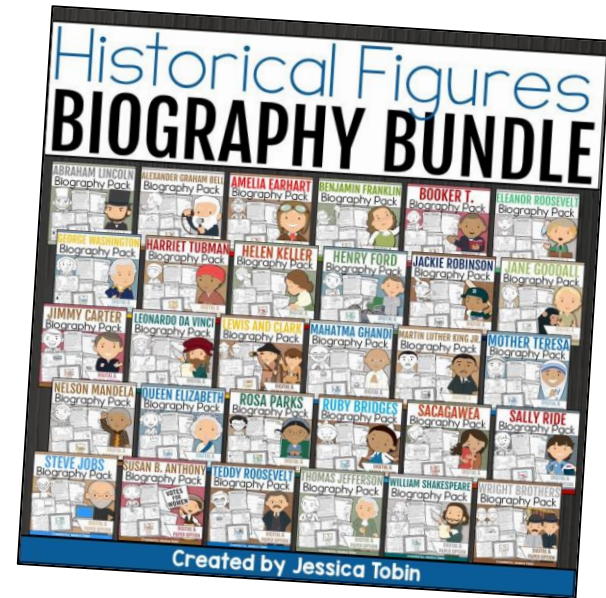
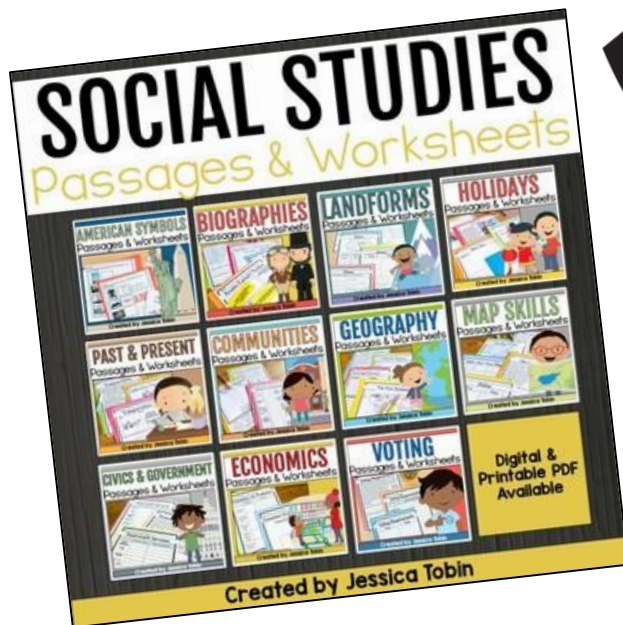
