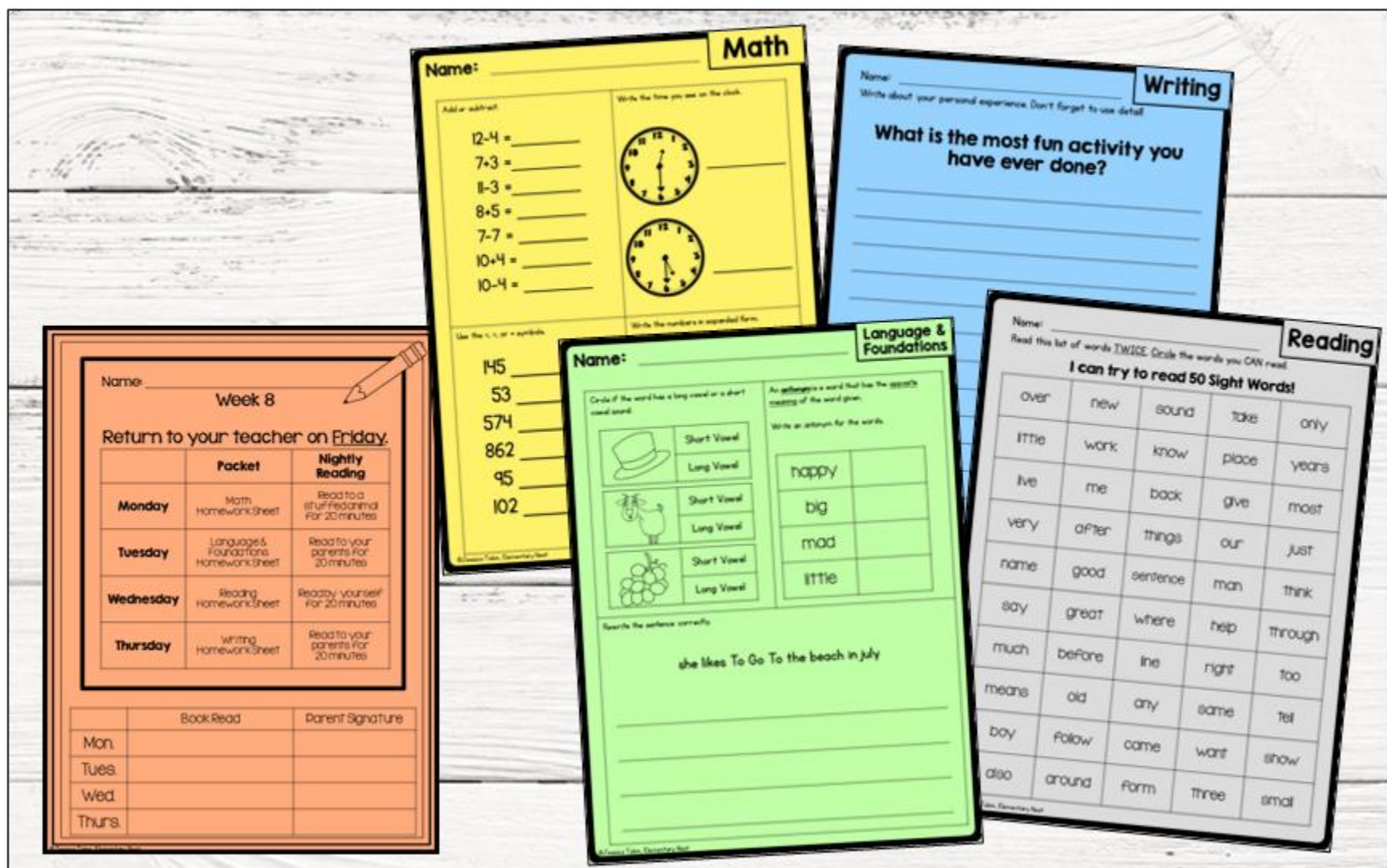

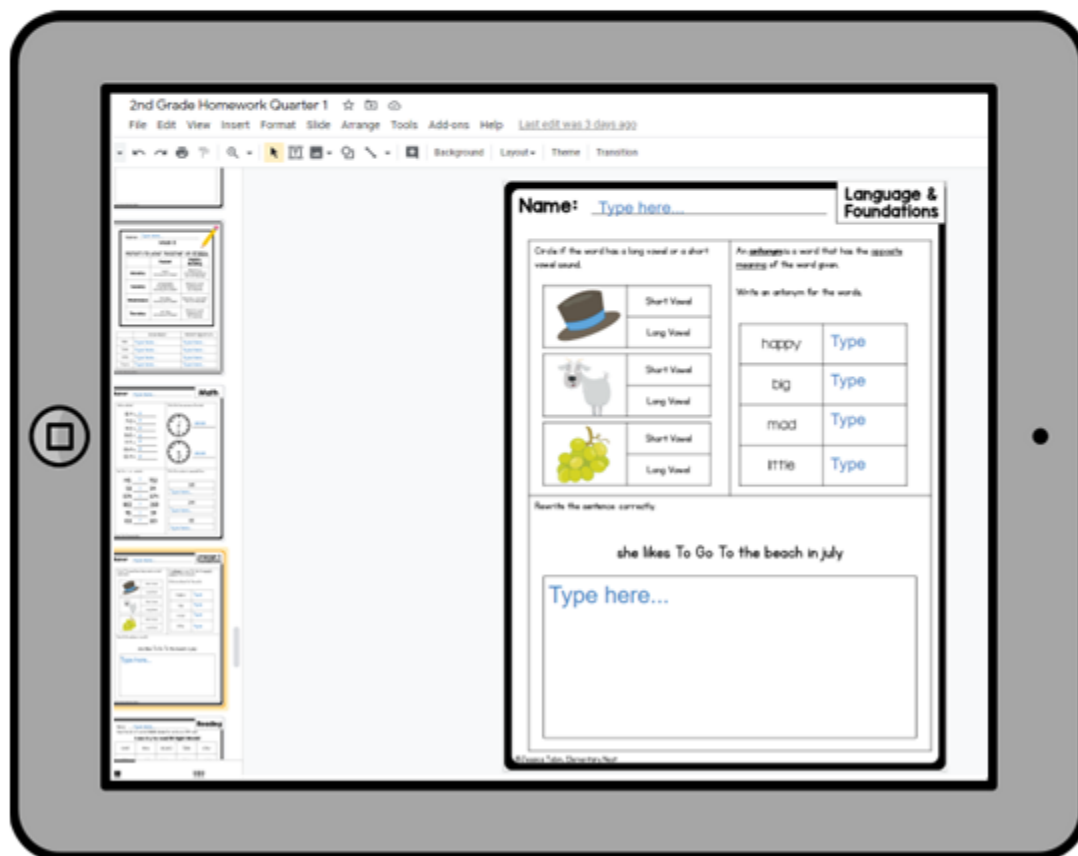
Reading
