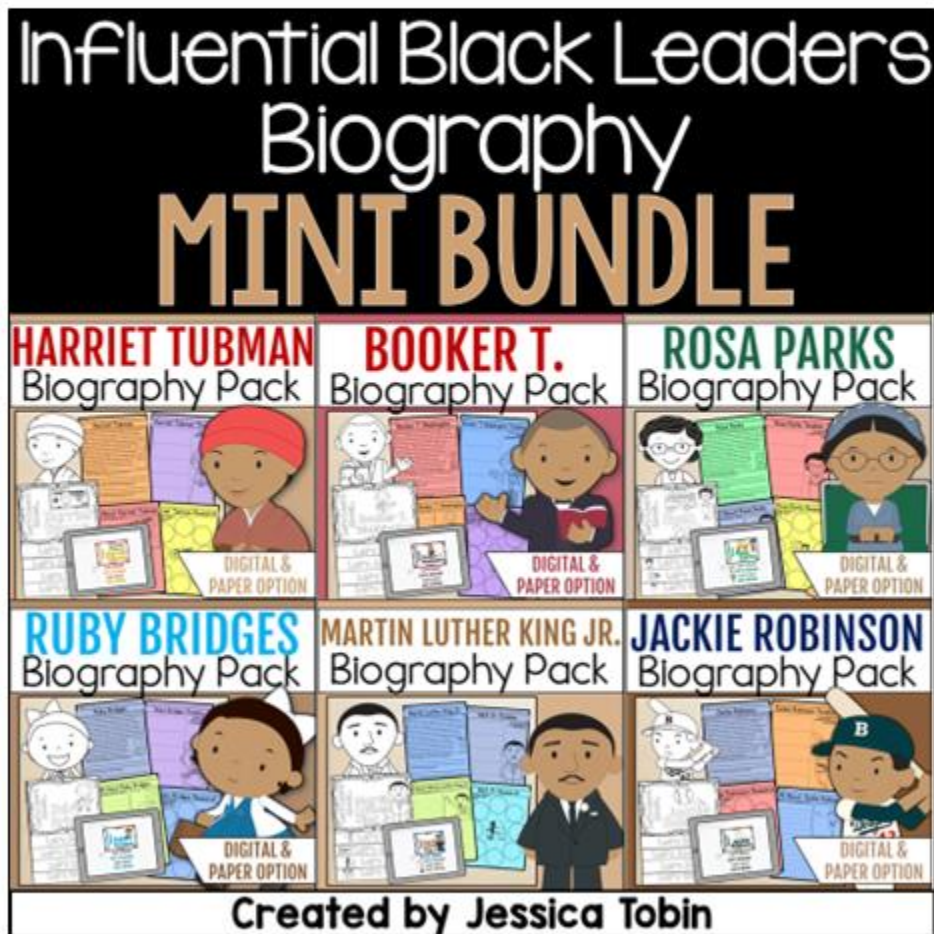

What you need:

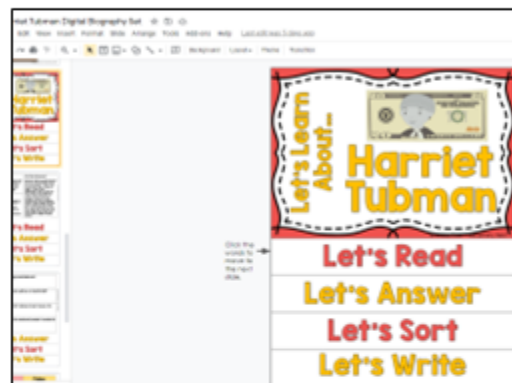
- A Google Classroom account

Rosa Parks

Rosa Parks is very influential woman in history. She was born in Alabama in 1913 and attended an all-girl school for African Americans. At that time in history, that separated people because of their skin color. She went to high school and became a member of the NAACP, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, an organization that fought for equality and believed in civil rights. Parks was on the Montgomery Bus Boycott. In 1955, Parks refused to stand up when a white man asked her to have her seat. This led to her arrest and led to the famous bus boycott. African Americans peacefully marched and boycotted the bus for over a year until the laws changed.

Rosa Parks was born on February 4th, 1913. She lived in Alabama. When she started going to school, she went to an all-girl school for African Americans. Back then, segregation kept African Americans and white people apart simply based on their skin color. Different races were treated very unfairly. They were not given the same rights as white people. There were segregated schools, stores, and more.

Rosa Parks graduated high school at age 20. She was a part of the NAACP, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. This group fought for the rights of people of color, no matter what skin color. She was a civil rights leader who peacefully worked towards equal rights for all.

Rosa Parks will always be remembered for one day on a bus. She sat in a spot on a bus and a bus driver told her to move. When she tried to move and say no, she was arrested and put in jail. She helped to organize a boycott of the Montgomery bus system. A year-long boycott of the Montgomery bus system was finally decided to allow people to be segregated.

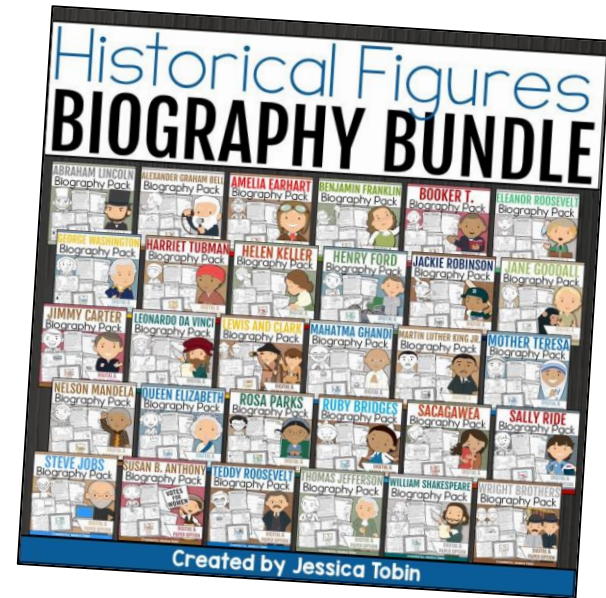
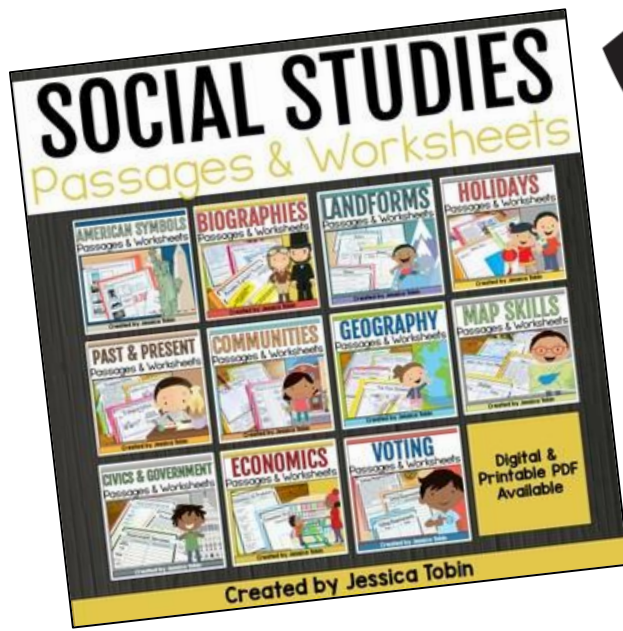
