



- •The second read is what my kiddos call the warm read because it's practice after their cold read.
- •And the final read is the hot read. This passage has been read and practiced several times and possibly even had comprehension questions answered.

The coding strategies that I use are:

- · / slashes for errors
- · circles or "SC" over top of self-corrects
- ] brackets around the final word that a student lands on

I will count up each word that a student reads through on each read. Then, I will subtract the number of errors. However, self-corrects do not count against their reading score.
